



TOEIC Bridge® Test

Der TOEIC®-Test überprüft die Fähigkeit von Nicht-Muttersprachlern berufszugehöriges Englisch am Arbeitsplatz einzusetzen. Speziell für Kandidaten mit Anfänger- und Grundkenntnissen wurde der TOEIC Bridge® Test entwickelt. Der Test misst das Hör- und Leseverständnis und wird dank zuverlässiger Testergebnisse von internationalen Unternehmen, Sprachschulen und Behörden geschätzt. Erst 2020 wurde der TOEIC Bridge® Test aktualisiert und ist als Online-Test verfügbar. Der Testaufbau und die Testzeit sind identisch zum papierbasierten TOEIC Bridge® Test. Die Punkteskala liegt seitdem zwischen 30-100 Punkten.

- Stufenloser Placement Test mit Einordnung in das jeweilige GER*-Niveau (keine Pass-or-Fail Prüfung)
- mit Papier und Bleistift oder am Computer
- Durchführung in autorisierten TOEIC®-Testzentren
- Individuelle Terminvereinbarung

TOEIC Bridge® Test

The TOEIC Bridge® tests focus on communication tasks in everyday life and common workplace scenarios that reflect modern language uses and communication methods. Aligned with recognized international language-learning frameworks including CEFR and CLB*, they provide a useful and reliable way to measure and compare individuals' basic to intermediate English communication skills.

The TOEIC Bridge® Test test measures English proficiency in 2 English communication skills -Listening and Reading as paper based test as well as online.

The TOEIC Bridge® Test has been updated in 2020. The structure is identical to the paper based version of the TOEIC Bridge® Test. The Redesigned TOEIC Bridge test has now a score scale of 30-100 points.

Test Format

- Non-incremental placement test with CEFR* mapping (no pass-or-fail exam)
- Pencil and paper or online test
- Administered in authorized TOEIC® test centers
- Individual test sessions available by appointment

Language Level

A1-B1 in accordance with CEFR*

Usage

- Evaluation and certification of the receptive English-language skills for job starters and professionals with basic knowledge
- Placement, progress monitoring and exit test for English-language trainings programs
- Motivation and preparation for the TOEIC® **Listening & Reading test**

Structure

Listening: 50 multiple choice questions in 25 min.

Reading: 50 multiple choice questions in 35 min.

Test Length

Results

Can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

* CEFR: The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages outlines an ascending series of common reference levels for describing learner proficiency. This CEFR describes both knowledge and skills in positive “can-do” statements at six levels of proficiency for different language skills from A1 level (Basic User - Breakthrough) to C2 level (Proficient User - Mastery). ** The CEFR provides a descriptive context that may be used to interpret the meaning and practical significance of scores on language tests. When language test scores can be related to CEFR levels, and this relationship can be adequately justified, the meaning of test scores and what candidates at minimum score levels are likely able to do may be clearer.
